Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

The bill expands the eligibility for the well compensation program to include wells that have been contaminated by fecal bacteria originating from livestock.

Estimated Fiscal Effect--Awards:

The fiscal effect of the bill is based on an estimate of 20 livestock-related well compensation claims per year. Assuming that each claimant receives the maximum award of \$9,000, the bill would increase well compensation awards by \$180,000 (20 awards x \$9,000). These claims will be paid from the Department's existing well compensation appropriation. It should be noted that the estimate of the number of claims per year may be low. Depending upon weather and other factors, the actual number of claims may be as high as 50 per year.

Estimated Fiscal Effect--Operations

The bill would increase operations costs by an estimated \$11,700 in salary-related expenditures associated with 1) review and approval of well compensation claims, 2) issuing well compensation awards, and 3) processing payment claims.

- 1) Review and approval of well compensation claims: It is estimated that it will take approximately 12 hrs. for a water supply specialist to review each well compensation application and determine eligibility.
- 20 well compensation claims x 12 hours/claim = 240 hours x \$32/hour salary and fringe = \$7,700
- 2) Issuing well compensation grant awards: It is estimated that it will take approximately 3 hrs. for a Financial Assistance Specialist to review each well compensation claim, complete a cost estimate and prepare a grant award.
- 20 grant awards x 3 hours/claim = 60 hours x 33/hr. salary and fringes = 2,000
- 3) Processing Payment claims: It is estimated that it will take approximately 3 hrs. for a Financial Assistance Specialist to review and approve each well compensation payment claim.
- 20 payment claims x 3 hours/claim = 60 hours x \$33/hr. salary and fringes = \$2,000

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

In the event that future livestock-related well compensation claims far exceed the Department's estimate, the existing appropriation will be insufficient to fully fund the claims.
