What do you expect the night class students to do when their class is 3 hours long and they have no time to go move their car? Pay for parking, you would say, that could work if there was enough paid parking areas or structures. All you are doing by making the parking situation worse is discouraging other students to admit to the university. For one, student residents of this area deserve adequate parking on the streets 784. near their homes just as much as non-student residents. Landlords in the area have a practice of charging a high rent for properties, which typically leads to packing as many students into a property as possible so they can divide the high rent to make it affordable. There are rarely enough parking spots available for student residents, leading to excess expense and frustration. Landlords should be required to provide ample parking, or limit tenants in properties to guarnatee parking for all (perhaps with a corresponding decrease in rental fee), this is particulary relevant for Shorewood residents, who don't have street parking as an option! Second, as a graduate assistant it was stressed to me that one of our major initiatives at UWM is "Access to Success" - which involves providing as many resouces as possible to non-traditional students, as they are one of our strengths at UWM, to ensure they can succeed despite greater challenges relative to traditional (i.e., full-time) students. While I am a full-time student, with ample parking and a nearby residence, I have several students and peers that work part- or full-time and attempt to make it to class on time before or after work. This typically requires too little of a time crunch to make the parking shuttle from remote parking by the lake or west of here. These students are then required to find parking nearby UWM, which would put them at a disadvantage if this bill limited their options. I think this initiative would cause the largest imposition and hardship on these non-traditional students, as full-time students who came during the day would likely fill up the campus and close street spots. This would be against our campus-wide effort to facilitate the learning experience of these individuals. Dear Senator Kedzie,

Thank you for holding a public hearing on the parking bill that would allow for the creation of a residential parking program in the neighborhoods surrounding UW-Milwaukee. As we noted in our testimony, SB 329 will allow for the alteration of the existing resident street parking rules so homeowners who live near the campus can find relief from the crammed streets and non-existent parking options they face seemingly everyday.

We have informally polled the members of the Senate Transportation and Natural Resources Committee and believe there is sufficient support to pass this legislation. Therefore, we respectfully request you hold an executive session on SB 329 at your committee's earliest convenience.

Legislative and gubernatorial approval of this bill will give the Milwaukee city attorney the ability to craft an ordinance that can be dissected, debated and finalized at the local level. We have every confidence that all those with an interest in off-campus parking issues will have their voices heard and their opinions taken seriously. Eventually, the end result of this collaborative effort will be more students having the ability to park on campus, and more homeowners enjoying an open space to park near their homes.
