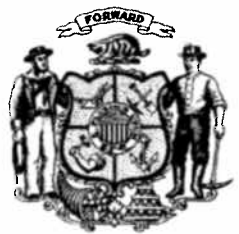

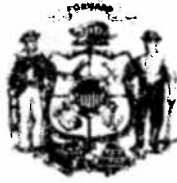

Dear Senator Brown:

I am requesting that you schedule a public hearing on Senate Bill 98, a bill that would require that all contractual services purchased by state executive branch agencies be performed within the United States. Senate Bill 98 has been referred to your committee.

This bill is a companion bill to Assembly Bill 186, which is scheduled for a public hearing by the Assembly Budget Review Committee. The American Jobs Act would help make Wisconsin a more business-friendly place by steering state contracts to businesses here at home. This legislation encourages state agencies to look first to American companies and American workers for services paid for with tax dollars. This bill keeps money in our economy by preventing jobs that could be done in this country from being sent overseas.

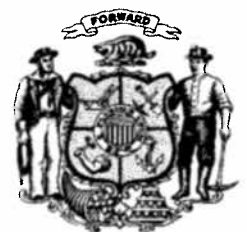
