#### Description

Prohibiting use of social security numbers on state civil service examinations, prohibiting requests by merchants for customers' social security numbers, posting certain personal information in government records on the Internet, prohibiting access to certain public records and employer records containing the social security numbers of individuals, prohibiting a register of deeds from recording certain instruments that contain more than a partial social security number, prohibiting the number of credit inquiries as a factor in credit reports, granting rule-making authority, and providing penalties

### **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

This bill creates several provisions intended to protect individuals' Social Security Numbers (SSNs) and personal information.

- 1. The bill prohibits the State Civil Service system from using SSNs to identify applicants on any civil service examination.
- 2. The bill prohibits retailers from requesting that a customer disclose the customer's SSN, with the exception of retailers acting as agents for DNR hunting and fishing licenses since DNR is required by statute to obtain the SSN of hunting and fishing license applicants.
- 3. The bill creates prohibitions on state and local governments posting on the internet public records with certain information about individuals.
- 4. The bill establishes requirements for custodians of public and employer records to redact SSNs and personal information before releasing records, with certain exceptions.
- 5. The bill prohibits credit reporting agencies from using the number of creditor inquiries as a factor in credit scoring.

The second provision of the bill, relating to merchant's access to social security numbers, has a substantial fiscal impact on the Department of Transportation.

Similar to DNR, DOT is required to obtain the SSN of motor vehicle title applicants. Under S.342.16(1)(a), effective June 30, 2007, all licensed motor vehicle dealers are required to process titles for DOT, and thus will be required to obtain SSNs of customers. Similarly, under S.341.21, entities other than dealers may contract with DOT to process applications for titles. However, under this bill, motor vehicle dealers and other retailers who might contract with DOT to process title applications would be prohibited from obtaining social security numbers to process motor vehicle title applications.

2005 Act 25 (2005-07 Biennial Budget) required the Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) to eliminate a total of 22.9 FTE over the biennium when it was mandated that motor vehicle dealers must process and electronically transmit vehicle title applications for each vehicle sale in Wisconsin.

If 2007 AB102 were enacted as drafted, DMV would need to re-assume the processing work currently outsourced to motor vehicle dealers. This expansion in work duties would require an additional 22.9 FTE for a cost of \$971,000 in annual salary and fringe costs, \$80,200 in annual support (supplies and services) costs, and \$183,200 in one-time support costs.

1. Salary and Fringe Costs:

Total Annual Salary Cost for 2.0 Transportation Customer Representative (TCR)-1 positions, 10.1 TCR-2 positions, 6.8 TCR-3 positions, and 4.0 TCR-4 positions is \$663,000. Total annual fringe costs for these positions is \$308,100.

2. Annual Support (Supplies and Services) Costs:

\$80,200.00

3. One-time Support (Supplies and Services) Costs:

In addition to the staffing impact, there are several other implications that are difficult to quantify. For instance, there are current vendor contracts in place that would need to be broken, with possible financial penalties to result. Additionally, there would be outstanding questions as to how a consumer would title a car if this bill were enacted. Prior to electronic transmittal, dealers still had responsibility to collect social security numbers to record lien holders for WisDOT title processing. There would be significant potential liabilities if a lien were not added to the title.
