Relating to: issuance of certain hunting approvals to certain members of the U.S. armed forces							

Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Summary: This bill allows the Department to issue wild turkey hunting licenses, Canada goose hunting permits, and special deer hunting permits to state residents who are in active military service, and who are stationed outside the state but are on furlough or leave within the state. This bill would exempt these individuals from the Department's cumulative point system when applying for these hunting licenses and permits and exempt them from any application deadlines, allowing them to purchase a license or permit at any time during the season.

Assumptions and Fiscal Estimate: Under the Department's cumulative point system for special hunting licenses and permits, customers apply by purchasing an application to be considered for these specialized hunts since the number of applicants exceeds the number of permits available throughout the state. The application process requires a \$3 per application fee.

Based on information provided through the Wisconsin Department of Military Affairs, the Department assumes that there are approximately 12,300 Wisconsin residents in active military service stationed outside this state. The Department assumes that of these service personnel, up to twenty percent would take advantage of the opportunity presented by this bill to purchase a special hunting license or permit while on furlough or leave within the state. The Department would issue the permits or licenses to these qualifying individuals. The Department assumes that the active duty military personnel applying for these permits would have applied for them absent this bill. That is, the effect of this bill would be to guarantee these individuals a license or permit and exempt them from the \$3 application fee for consideration through the the Department's cumulative points system.

Based on the assumptions listed above, this bill would reduce permit/license application fee revenue by an amount equal to \$3 multiplied by the number of applications. However, each of the individuals exempted from the cumulative point system application fee would still have to purchase the applicable hunting license or permit. This would increase revenue to the segregated state Conservation Fund by some amount that exceeds the revenue reduction related to the cumulative point system exemption. However, because availability and sales of special hunting permits and licenses varies by zone throughout the state, the Department cannot reliably estimate whether each of these exemption-related sales would qualify as an additional sale above what would be sold were it not for this exemption. Therefore, the fiscal effect is listed as "indeterminate."
