Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Currently, there is not sufficient data to determine if additional Assistant District Attorneys (ADAs) would be needed if this bill were to be enacted. However, in time there may be more trials because of the potential for increased penalties (larger fines and increased jail time) for offenders and because the defendant has nothing to lose by going to trial. If there is an increase in the number of jury trials, this would require additional ADAs.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

In the future, there could be more trials because of the potential for increased penalties for offenders and because the offenders have nothing to lose by having a trial jury. This could result in a need for additional ADAs.
