Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Under the bill, any company that hires an illegal alien is, for a period of two years, ineligible to receive any property tax exemption under Chapter 70 or any income or franchise tax credit under Chapter 71. Companies that hire an illegal alien would also be barred for a period of two years from contracting with state agencies or local governments for supplies, services, construction, or repairs, and would be barred from receiving any grants or loans from local governmental units for a period of two years. Additionally, a company that hires an illegal alien would be subject to a fine of \$5,000 for each illegal alien the company hires.

Fiscal Estimate

While denying income and franchise tax credits would in general increase revenue, data is not available to estimate the fiscal effect of this proposal. Any denial of a property tax exemption would result in a property tax shift from other taxpayers to the affected entities. The Department is unable to determine which businesses would hire illegal aliens. As a result, the Department cannot determine the fiscal effect of denying tax credits or property tax exemptions to those businesses for two years.
