Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

2007 Assembly Bill 877 creates s. 175.48, relating to carrying of concealed weapons by retired law enforcement officers.

Under AB 877 the Department of Justice (DOJ) may issue to a law enforcement officer who retired from DOJ or from a federal law enforcement agency a card certifying that the officer is qualified to carry a concealed weapon. DOJ shall design the certification card.

Prior to issuing a certification card, DOJ will have to verify: that the applicant was regularly employed as a DOJ or federal law enforcement officer, retired as a DOJ or federal law enforcement officer in good standing for reasons other than mental instability, and has a nonforfeitable right to benefits under the retirement plan of the law enforcement agency from which he or she retired; that the applicant is not prohibited under federal law from possessing a firearm; and that the applicant has, during the previous 12 months, met certain standards for training and qualification to carry a firearm.

Prior to annual renewal of a certification card, DOJ will have to verify that the applicant is not prohibited under federal law from possessing a firearm and that the applicant has, during the previous 12 months, met certain standards for training and qualification to carry a firearm.

DOJ currently possesses equipment capable of producing certification cards. DOJ also has the capability to verify the information relating to applicants' retirement, firearm possession, and firearm training status. In addition, DOJ does not anticipate a large number of applicants under the provisions of AB 877. As a result, DOJ anticipates being able to absorb costs associated with implementing AB 877. If the number of applicants is significant, DOJ may need additional resources.
