

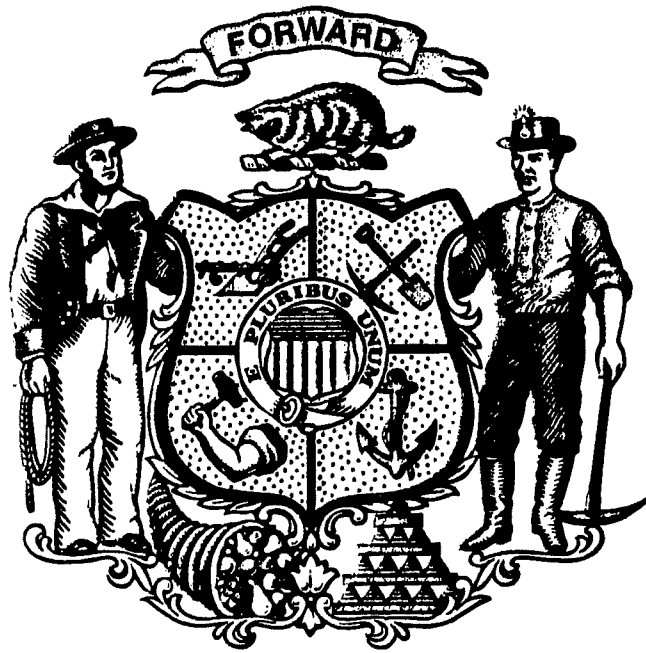

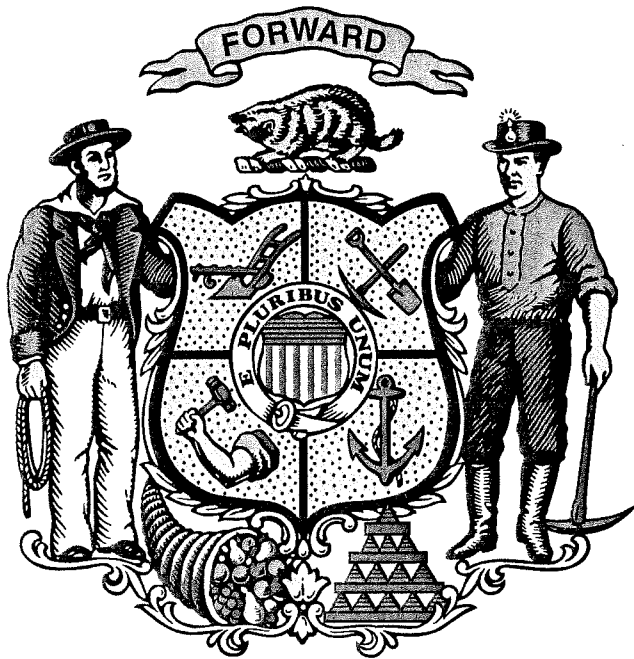

Re: Support of 2007 Assembly Bill 228: Transfer of Licenses and Permits to Minors

Honorable Rep. Gunderson:

On behalf of the Wisconsin Conservation Congress (WCC), I would like to thank you for sponsoring Assembly Bill 228, pertaining to the transfer of limited draw hunting, fishing and trapping licenses and permits to minors. The Conservation Congress is in support of AB 228 and is eager to see its passage. As the bill author, you know how important this bill is to help provide future generations with the opportunity to hunt, fish and trap in this state.

Obviously, the citizens of this state feel as we do. Based on the returns from the 2007 Spring Hearings and Annual Conservation Congress County meetings, one of the WCC Executive Council's advisory questions asked if the attendees of the Spring Hearings supported the concept that your bill endorses. The question specifically asked if voters are in favor of the DNR and the Legislature working together to make it possible for an adult to transfer any harvest permit or tag to a youth, without the youth losing their preference points. This advisory question passed with a positive vote in all 72 counties, and the popular vote was 2,536 in favor and only 651 individuals were in opposition.

As you know, a procedure similar to the system proposed in your legislation is currently in place for transferring a bear harvest permit to a youth under the age of 18. This system has kept more youth involved and interested in hunting. This is imperative at a time when research continues to show a downward trend in our ability to recruit new young hunters. There are so many other distractions, and parents, guardians and mentors need every tool they can use to make sure kids stay interested and engaged in hunting, fishing and trapping. Again, we offer our appreciation for your leadership on this issue.

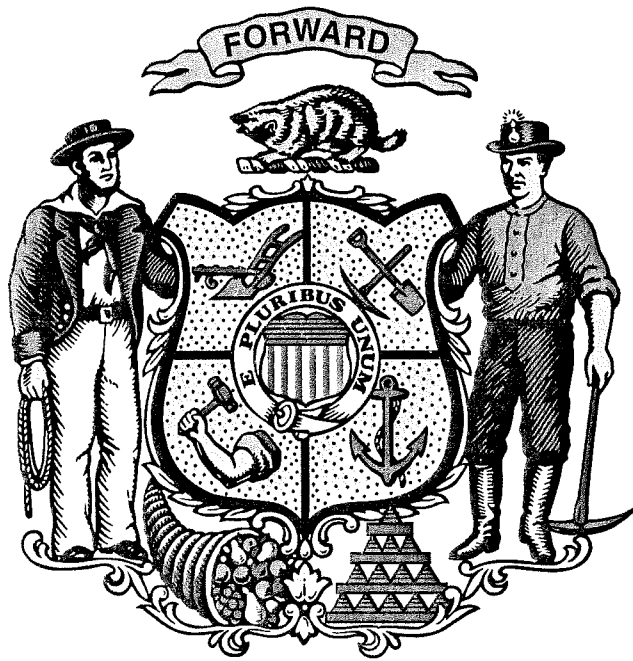
