Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Bill Summary: Currently, if a court imposes a forfeiture or fine on a person for a violation of an environmental law, the court must also impose an environmental surcharge equal to 10 percent of the amount of the forfeiture or fine. Environmental surcharges are deposited into the Environmental Management (EM) Account of the Environmental Fund and 50 percent of the amount of environmental surcharges is appropriated for environmental education grants awarded by the Environmental Education Board. This bill increases the environmental surcharge to 20 percent of a forfeiture or fine imposed for the violation of an environmental law.

Fiscal Estimate: Given the doubling of the percentage of the surcharge, the Department assumes the surcharge revenue will also double. Environmental surcharge revenue for the past three fiscal years has averaged approximately \$181,100 (FY05, \$192,900; FY06, \$270,000; FY07, \$90,200: FY08 \$171,400). Therefore, the Department assumes that this bill will increase surcharge revenues by approximately \$181,100 annually, which will in turn be split between the Environmental Management Account and the University of Wisconsin. The Department assumes there will be no fiscal impact to local governments resulting from this bill.
