### Description

Requiring the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection to establish standards for products sold as honey, prohibiting the labeling as Wisconsin certified honey of a product that has not been determined to meet the standards, prohibiting the labeling as honey of a product that does not meet the standards, and requiring the exercise of rule-making authority

## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

This bill requires the department to establish standards for products sold as honey. Those standards must be consistent with the standard under the UN Food and Agriculture Organization Codex Alimentarius. The bill also requires the department to establish standards for private laboratories to follow in testing honey.

The bill prohibits the labeling of a product as "Wisconsin certified honey" unless it meets the standards above, was produced in this state, and unless a summary of the laboratory test is submitted to the department. The bill requires the department to investigate violations of the Wisconsin certified honey labeling requirements.

Finally, the bill also prohibits the labeling of a product as "honey" unless it meets the standards above. The bill authorizes individuals who suffer damages to bring an action against the violator.

Under the bill, the department would be required to perform three tasks:

- 1. Promulgate rules establishing honey standards and laboratory testing standards,
- 2. Receive and approve applications to label products as "Wisconsin certified honey," and
- 3. Investigate and take legal action against violators of the "Wisconsin certified honey" provisions of the bill. (The department would also be able to investigate mislabeling of products as "honey" under its general investigatory powers.)

The department expects rule-making under this bill to be relatively simple and that rule-making costs may be able to be absorbed by the department.

The department estimates that fewer than 100 applications per year would be made to label products as "Wisconsin certified honey." The department anticipates covering the costs of processing such registrations through fee set in rule, in a manner similar to the Something Special from Wisconsin labeling program. This estimate assumes that the department would not make any additional efforts to market or promote the "Wisconsin certified honey" label.

Based on a similar law in Florida, the department estimates that it would investigate up to six cases per year concerning the mislabeling of honey. In general, an investigation requires 100 hours of staff time. Six investigations would therefore require 0.3 FTE positions. Each investigation would also incur approximately \$500 in laboratory and materials costs. Annual costs for six investigations would be approximately \$24,000. The department may be able to absorb up to this level of additional costs.
