Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

PROVISIONS OF THE BILL

This bill makes several statutory changes to laws relating to Low-Speed Vehicles (LSV's). Currently, Wisconsin statute only addresses one type of LSV – a Neighborhood Electric Vehicle (NEV), which is an LSV propelled by electric power.

This bill removes the term "Neighborhood Electric Vehicle" from the statutes and instead defines a "Low-Speed Vehicle," which includes all vehicles that conform to the federal definition and requirements for Low-Speed Vehicles, not simply NEV's that are powered by electric power.

The bill applies biennial registration and the \$23 biennial registration fee that currently applies to NEV to an LSV. The bill applies NEV's current exemption from the title environmental impact fee and supplemental title fee to an LSV.

This bill allows operation of an LSV on highways under the jurisdiction, for maintenance purposes, of a municipality or county that has a speed limit of 35 miles per hour or less, unless the municipality or county adopts an ordinance to prohibit LSV operation on some or all of its highways. This local "opt-out" provision is in contrast to current law's "opt-in" provision that local government must adopt an ordinance to allow NEV operation on its highways with speed limits of 35 miles per hour or less.

The bill allows LSV operation through intersections crossing state trunk highways or connecting highways where the intersection has a speed limit of 35 miles per hour or less and the intersection is controlled by traffic control signals. This bill prohibits operation of an LSV through intersections crossing an expressway, freeway, or controlled access highway.

The bill allows LSV operation on a connecting highway having a speed limit of 25 miles per hour or less, or if the municipality or county with jurisdiction has adopted an ordinance allowing operation on a connecting highway having a speed limit up to 35 miles per hour and the Department of Transportation has given written consent.

The bill prohibits operation of an LSV on highways that are not authorized under the bill, and prohibits LSV operation at more than 25 miles per hour. The bill establishes a penalty for violation of forfeiture of up to \$200 and 2 demerit points on the violator's driver's license.

The bill takes effect on the first day of the 5th month after publication.
