Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill increases the amount of tax benefits Commerce may allocate under the Angel and Early Stage Seed credits for calendar years 2009 and 2010, and then decreases them starting in 2011.

- 1. Angel Credit -- Under current law, \$5.5 million is available for calendar years 2008, 2009, and 2010. \$18 million, plus \$250,000 for nanotechnology businesses, is available starting in calendar year 2011. This bill sets the credit at \$8.775 million beginning in calendar year 2009.
- 2. Early Stage Seed Investment Credit -- Under current law, \$6 million is available for calendar years 2008, 2009, and 2010. \$18.5 million, plus \$250,000 for nanotechnology businesses, is available starting in calendar year 2011. This bill sets the credit at \$10.775 million beginning in calendar year 2009.

This bill will not change the workload of the Department of Commerce and will not have a fiscal effect on the department.
