Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Should this bill be enacted, it would change the classification of the crime from misdemeanor to felony. Some prosecutors believe this would require additional time (e.g. - more court appearances, more attorney preparation time, etc.) to prosecute these crimes. Due to a lack of data, however, it is difficult to quantify the additional time required; therefore, it is difficult to estimate what the fiscal impact would be on DA offices.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

Because this bill would change the classification of the crime from misdemeanor to felony, some prosecutors believe it will require more time to prosecute these crimes. Consequently, there would be a long-term fiscal impact, but without specific data it is difficult to quantify this.
