Description

The employment of minors 12 years of age or older by nonprofit organizations in and around the homes of elderly persons and persons with disabilities to perform snow shoveling, lawn mowing, leaf raking, and other similar work usual to those homes

Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill exempts non-profit organizations that hire minors to perform work at private residences of elderly persons or persons with a disability such as leaf raking, snow removal or other similar work from obtaining child labor work permits for these minors.

For every permit not issued to a non-profit organization, the state treasury will lose \$2.50 in revenue and the department will lose \$5.00. The \$5.00 portion of the \$10.00 work permit fee dedicated to the department is currently earmarked to fund six Equal Rights Officer positions. The department at this time does not have any means of estimating how many fewer child labor work permits would be issued each year if non-profit organizations are exempted from getting work permits for minors performing work around homes of elderly persons or persons with a disability.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

The actual loss of revenue created by the proposed exemption will have an on-going impact upon both the department's budget for the Equal Rights Officer positions funded by work permit fees and revenues contributed to the general fund.
