**Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

The department anticipates that an average of less than one employer per year will register with the department to conduct business in Wisconsin to use "traveling sales crews". Over the past 20 years the department has had a similar requirement for employers engaged in using minors in "door-to-door" sales to register with the department. Only about one employer per year has registered to conduct this type of business in Wisconsin. The department expects this legislation will have a similar impact.

The department anticipates it may receive one or two complaints per year alleging that traveling sales crews are illegally operating in Wisconsin. The department estimates the investigation of each complaint will take approximately 40 hours of an Equal Rights Officer - Senior's work time. The department believes it can absorb the additional workload.

The department estimates the cost of developing administrative regulations to implement this legislation will be a one time cost of \$1,500.00. The cost includes developing the regulations, holding a public hearing on the proposed rules and preparing and printing brochures to explain the new law and regulations to the public.
