Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Currently, a person who is convicted of distributing or delivering a controlled substance or controlled substance analog is guilty of a felony, penalties for which vary depending upon the substance or substance analog. This bill increases the maximum imprisonment portion of the penalty by five years, if the offense is committed in the presence of a child who is no more than ten years old.

A total of 1,494 offenders were admitted to prison with a drug related governing offense during FY2008. The Department can not estimate how many of these offenders are already sentenced to the maximum incarceration term or how many will be imprisoned for up to five additional years, for having committed their crime in the presence of a child.

The average FY09 annual cost for an inmate in a DOC institution is approximately \$31,800. However, when there is excess capacity in DOC facilities, the incremental costs (i.e. food, health care and clothing) of housing a small number of inmates is approximately \$4,900, based on FY09 costs. When there is no excess capacity in DOC facilities, as is currently the case, the Department uses contract beds at a rate of \$18,800 annually, per person.

There are no changes to local jail costs.
