

Bob,

Bob Margolies, Legislative Liaison for the DOC, called today to express some of the Department's concerns about this bill, which is authored by Rep. Friske. The public hearing was held on this bill on October 15th. A copy of the bill is attached. Bob Margolies, who is rather pushy, told me they didn't come to the public hearing because they had "bigger fish to fry." Anyway, their concerns, as I understand them, are:

- The bill doesn't address juvenile sex offenders (age 17 and under)
- Under the bill, the person who receives this information is defined as a "school district clerk." They feel this is too low-level of a position to be in charge of this information and would like to see it changed.
- They also have a mechanism where they work with local law enforcement to discuss who should be notified if a sex offender is released into a community, and there are 3 categories of notification from "all alert" (category 3), to schools (category 2), to no further notification, (category 1).
- After the 2005 session, the DOC added two enhancements to sex offender notification statutes: 1) a "Family Watchdog" website; and 2) an e-mail notification service where anyone can sign up and obtain geographical information for any sex offender(s).

In addition, Bob notified the Speaker's office about their concerns **first**, and then he was told to notify you. I would consider this as an attempt to go behind your back as chair. I also spoke to Friske's staffer, Tim, who said they may or may not try to do an amendment before the exec on Thursday. The bill went through the Criminal Justice Committee last session 11-0 but Lena Taylor held it up in the Senate. I reminded Tim of the 24 hour rule for amendments, but you did not enforce it when Kramer brought his amendment in at the last Exec. On Rep. Vos' bill. I am just following up with you because Bob Margolies asked me to bring their concerns to your attention. I told him the bill would probably pass and he said he believed it would also and did not seem too concerned.
