Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Assembly Bill (AB) 499 makes changes to the Wisconsin Workers' Compensation law. The Department of Administration (DOA) manages the state employees' worker's compensation program which is self-insured. The bill would increase the maximum weekly compensation rate for a disabled employee from \$312 to \$322. The bill also provides that the Department of Workforce Development (DWD) may, but is not required to, retain DOA to process, investigate and pay claims on its behalf.

DOA estimates that it will cost an additional \$5,000 per year for increased indemnity benefits. Changes to vocational rehabilitation benefits will not have a fiscally significant impact on DOA.

If DOA is retained by DWD to process, investigate and pay worker's compensation claims, DOA will incur additional staffing costs and would receive revenue from DWD.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

May increase costs by an indeterminate amount.
