Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill requires law enforcement agencies to collect a biological specimen for DNA analysis from each adult arrested for specific violations, and from each juvenile taken into custody for certain sexual assault offenses. The specimen is to be submitted to the crime laboratories. The individual from whom a biological specimen was obtained may request expungement of the information pertaining to them if they are not charged with a crime within one year of the arrest, if the person is a juvenile and a delinquency petition is not filed, criminal charges are dismissed, or if the person is found not guilty of the crime.

Prosecutors anticipate little or nor fiscal impact on their offices because most of the effort to collect specimens will be done by law enforcement agencies. Only occasionally will District Attorney offices need to be involved in filing petitions or, on rare occasions, issuing a misdemeanor charge against an individual who fails to comply.
