## Senate Committee on Education Senate Bill 100 Testimony May 25, 2011

Thank you Senator Olsen and members of the Senate Committee on Education for your attention to Senate Bill (SB) 100. I appreciate you taking the time to discuss SB 100, a bill that would make the cream puff Wisconsin's official state dessert. At a time of cynicism about the political process, it is refreshing to see young people engaged and excited about their government. ## The case for the cream puff as state dessert

- Cream puff sales support Wisconsin's \$59 billion agriculture and dairy industry.
- Cream puffs include cream, milk, butter and flour.
- 36 cream puffs can be made from one pound of cream.
- **Golden Guernsey Dairy of Waukesha** produces the cream for the State Fair cream puffs.
- The State Fair cream puff boxes are produced by **Great Lakes Packaging Corporation of Germantown**.
- **Hoffmaster Corporation of Oshkosh** and **Derksen of Omro** print and produce the paper plates, napkins and signage used at State Fair cream puff stands.
- **Valley Bakers Cooperative Association of Appleton** and **BakeMark of Menomonee Falls** supply the State Fair bakery with ingredients necessary to produce cream puffs 24 hours a day.
- Many other Wisconsin companies partner join forces to provide the equipment, supplies, vehicles, insurance, uniforms and safety necessary to keep cream puffs fresh for customers.
