By Senator Grothman; cosponsored by Representatives Stroebel, Bies, Strachota, Craig, Ripp, LeMahieu, Spiros, Kleefisch, Sanfelippo, T. Larson, Weatherston, Nass and A. Ott. (Report approved by the Governor with partial veto on 3-27-2013. 2011 Wisconsin Act 146)

(An "Aye" vote will override the Governor's position. A "No" vote will sustain the Governor's position)

Senate Bill 628. Relating to: the regulation of raffles. By (FE)Senators Leibham, Lazich and Gudex; cosponsored by Representatives Kuglitsch, Tittl, Ballweg, Bies, Knodl, Petryk, Skowronski, Strachota and Endsley. (**Report vetoed by the Governor on 3-27-2014**)
