Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

AB 345 requires public utilities to submit, for PSC approval, tariffs that specify the procedures involving utility customers that object to smart meter installation. Any Commission activity associated with the passage of this bill would be absorbed by current resources, including Commission consideration of the submitted tariffs.

Fiscal effects on local governments are indeterminate. Under the bill, if a public utility or cooperative association has installed a smart meter at the premises of a customer or member who objects to the installation, the public utility or cooperative association must remove the smart meter, it must pay to remove and replace the smart meter. As such, costs related to the implementation and execution of the required removal procedures may be incurred at the local government level for those municipalities that provide electric, natural gas or water utilities to their residents.
