### **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

The bill makes changes to local government authority of nonmetallic mining.

## Fiscal Effect

1. Bureau of Waste and Materials Management

The Bureau could experience a negligible amount of workload for staff that would need to update nonmetallic mining regulatory authorities on statutory changes.

2. Bureau of Watershed Management & Bureau of Water Quality

The bill could could impact staff workload to the extent that the grandfathering of existing sites and facilities could result in citizens getting more involved in providing input for stormwater, wastewater, or waterway & wetland permitting (e.g. more requests for public hearings) or filing more complaints to field staff about permit compliance, monitoring, and other water quality and quantity issues.

### 3. Local Government

The local fiscal effect is indeterminate. Workload could decrease to the extent that existing sites and facilities are grandfathered in, whereas workload could increase to the extent that local units of government will have to keep track of which ordinance(s) were in place when each nonmetallic mining operation begins extraction.
