## Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Current law allows DOT to issue agricultural emergency permits, upon determination by the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection that an agricultural emergency exists. Agricultural emergency permits allow vehicles transporting certain loads to exceed width limits that ordinarily apply. This bill modifies the list of commodities that may be transported under the permit, increases the width limit by 5", and allows vehicles to exceed normal height requirements by 1 foot to 14'6", which are similar to neighboring states. The proposal will have no fiscal impact on DOT.
