Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill requires the Department of Public Instruction to provide grants to school districts to develop and implement programs to prevent and reduce violence in schools. The bill appropriates \$24 million GPR, beginning in FY19, for this purpose.

Under the bill, DPI will establish, by rule, the eligibility criteria for these grants and the school violence reduction activities that may be funded with grant proceeds. The bill further specifies that grant proceeds may not be used to pay school district personnel costs.

State:

Increase state expenditures by (up to) \$24 million GRP annually beginning in FY19. In addition, the Department would need a 1.0 FTE position to administer a new grant program of this size and scope. The Department projects the total personnel costs for 1.0 FTE position would be \$118,5000 on an annual basis (based on average hourly rates of current department employees in the Education Consultant classification, and the associated fringe benefit, allocated fixed costs, travel, and supplies/services costs). See attached worksheet for a breakdown of the personnel costs.

Local:

Indeterminate. It is unknown how many school districts would apply for and be awarded a grant, or the grant amounts that would be awarded. Thus the net impact on school districts (cost of programming and offsetting grant revenues) are indeterminate.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

The \$24 million GPR appropriated beginning in FY19 and associated personnel costs of \$118,500 cost for a 1.0 FTE in FY 19 would be ongoing state expenditures, unless changed in the future by the legislature.
