Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

AB 224 provides funding to support hospitals, health systems, and educational entities that form health care education and training consortia for training allied health professionals, defined as any health care provider other than a physician, registered nurse, dentist, pharmacist, chiropractor, or podiatrist who provides diagnostic, technical, therapeutic, or direct patient care and support services to the patient. Under this bill, the Department may distribute up to \$125,000 per fiscal year per consortium, to a total of \$250,000 each fiscal year, from the appropriation under 20.435 (1) (fi), with preference given to rural programs. The grant would be used to create the education and infrastructure for new training opportunities for allied health professionals, or to support existing program costs such as books, tuition, or clinical site or simulation expenses. Grantees are expected to match the grant amount through their own funding sources.

The Department is required to determine the requirements for the formation of health care education and training consortia for allied health professionals. To complete these tasks, as well as develop the application, manage the request for application process, and provide support and oversee the grantees, the Department requires a 0.5 FTE Program and Policy Analyst – Advanced at a cost of \$40,900 GPR per year.
