### Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill creates a procedure for a defendant in a criminal case to seek access to the mental health treatment records of a crime victim that are not already in the possession of or under control of a government agency if those records contain information crucial to the defendant's case.

This bill also adds enumerated rights to the basic bill of rights for victims regarding the right to privacy in a victim's mental health treatment records.

Since this bill is specific to records not under possession of a government agency it is not anticipated that the bill, as proposed, would have any fiscal effect on the Department of Corrections.
