Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

The bill requires DNR to identify and repeal all administrative rules promulgated by DNR that relate to the regulation of air pollutants that are not regulated by federal law. In addition, the bill provides that any rule promulgated by DNR that relates to the regulation of an air pollutant that is not regulated under federal law expires 10 years after the rule takes effect. Finally, the bill provides that DNR may promulgate a rule to readopt an expiring rule using the standard rule-making process no sooner than the year prior to the rule's expiration.

Fiscal Effect

A. Revenues

The bill would result in the repeal of ch. NR 445 (Control of Hazardous Pollutants), Wis. Adm. Code and revisions to chs. NR 406 (Construction Permits), 407, (Operation Permits), 410 (Air Permit, Emission and Inspection Fees), 415 (Control of Particulate Emissions), 429 (Malodorous Emissions and Open Burning), 439 (Reporting, Recordkeeping, Testing, Inspection and Determination of Compliance Requirements) and 446 (Control of Mercury Emissions), Wis. Adm. Code. This repeal and revisions will result in reduced program revenue in fees collected for air permit review for new or modified sources and annual emission inventory reporting and payment for air pollutants not regulated under federal law (-\$25,000 in revenue).

B. Costs

The bill would eventually result in minimal reduced costs for any state and local government source that is a source of air pollutants not regulated under federal law, as they would not have to identify, report or pay fees on emissions of these pollutants.

The bill would eventually result in increased program costs of \$50,000 and 0.5 FTE/year over the 2 to 3 years it typically takes to do rulemaking. This effort would vary over the 2 to 3 year period and would be managed as a reallocation of existing staff time.

In addition, the bill allows for potential promulgation or re-adoption of a rule relating to the control of an air pollutant that is not regulated under federal law. No estimated costs are included in this fiscal estimate for such efforts.
