### Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

#### Income Waiver

Assembly Bill 733 waives initial credential fees for any applicant for a professional license where the applicant's household income is at or below 180 percent of the Federal Poverty Level.

The department would incur one-time costs associated with: 1) updating existing forms and creating new forms; 2) updating operating procedures; 3) training staff on the new forms and procedures; and, 4) updating the department's website.

The department has no way of determining what percentage of applicants for licensure are at or below 180 percent of the Federal Poverty Level, as the department does not currently request income information from applicants. The department estimates that it would take an additional five minutes to process an application in which the applicant requests a fee waiver. This would create an additional labor cost of \$1.29 per application. For every one percent of initial license applicants that request the fee waiver, the department would incur approximately \$700 in additional processing expenses.

The department would also see reduced revenues from the fee waiver. For every one percent of applicants that would receive the fee waiver, the department would see a revenue decrease of approximately \$42,800.

For example, if fifteen percent of applicants requested and received the fee waiver, the department would incur \$10,500 in additional processing costs and a decrease in revenue of \$642,000.

#### Veterans Waiver

Under current law, a veteran may apply for a fee waiver from initial credentialing fees if the veteran has not already received a fee waiver. Assembly Bill 733 would allow a veteran to apply for a fee waiver for an initial credentialing fee even if he or she has already received a fee waiver. The department is unable to determine the impact of this provision.
