Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

The bill's only effect on the Wisconsin Elections Commission is that the four selecting authorities shall certify to the Commission Administrator, as the State's chief election officer, the names of their appointees to the temporary redistricting advisory commission, and that commission must also certify its appointment of the fifth commission member to the Commission Administrator. The bill does not specify any other action to be taken by the Commission or its chief election officer. Receiving the names of the appointees to the temporary redistricting advisory commission will not have a fiscal effect on the Commission.
