Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

SB-016 directs WEDC to allocate at least \$125,000 per fiscal year from the appropriations under 20.192 to make grants for new businesses to hire student interns.

Under this bill, the corporation could make 42 or more entrepreneurial assistance grants per year.

In FY16, WEDC contracted with 77 entrepreneurial-related businesses. Assuming that the number of contracts with entrepreneurial-related businesses increases by 42 during the first year and between 12-42 each year thereafter, it is estimated that WEDC would need to hire an account manager, underwriter, and administrative assistant to meet the new statutory requirements. The estimated cost (salary and benefits) of the additional staffing requirements is \$238,000 per year.

This proposal would have a net neutral fiscal effect on the State; however, this would require WEDC to divert funding from existing programs and activities to support the statutory requirements and meet staffing costs.
