## Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

As part of 2011 Act 22, the Legislature removed the requirement that incumbent local exchange carriers (ILECs; AT&T as an example) provide basic voice service available to all residential customers within its local exchange area. Wisconsin Stat. § 196.503 sunset as of April 30, 2013, and there is currently no provider of last resort obligations for WI ILECs. 2011 Act 22 largely, but not entirely, removed the Commission's regulatory authority over telecommunications utilities based on increased competition and new technology in the telecommunications world.

SB 426 would reinstate the provider of last resort obligations for WI ILECs, remove a previous waiver process, and give the Commission a new discretionary complaint/investigation and enforcement authority over ILECs to ensure they comply with the reinstated requirement to provide basic voice service through the use of any technology or mode.

SB 426 increases the regulatory authority of the Commission over ILECs, it is anticipated that this would require additional staff time and resources to recreate these functions at the Commission.
