## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

This bill creates a \$5,000 surcharge to be imposed on persons who are convicted of patronizing or soliciting prostitutes, pandering, or keeping a place of prostitution. Under this bill the surcharge amounts collected are used for treatment and services for sex-trafficking victims and for criminal investigative operations and law enforcement relating to Internet crimes against children.

The DOC admitted 9 offenders into prison in 2016 under the following statutes for prostitution offenses affected in this bill:

Wis. Stat. 944.32 [01]: 5Wis. Stat. 944.33(2) [01]: 2Wis. Stat. 944.34(1) [01]: 2

The DOC placed 16 people (one person had convictions under two statutes) on probation in 2016 under the following statutes for prostitution offenses affected in this bill:

Wis Stat. 944.32: 4
Wis. Stat. 944.33(1): 3
Wis. Stat. 944.33(2): 3
Wis. Stat. 944.34(1): 4
Wis. Stat. 944.34(2): 3

DOC estimates that there will be no financial impact as a result of this bill. This bill does not impact the number of people sentenced for prostitution offenses nor the sentencing practices of judges. Additionally, DOC's existing staffing would be able to handle collecting the prostitution crime surcharge for offenders that have outstanding balances during their community supervision or prison sentence.
