Assumption's Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

2017 Senate Bill 667 provides an additional \$100,000 General Purpose Revenue (GPR) for administration of the livestock premises registration program. Currently \$250,000 GPR is appropriated for this program.

The livestock premises registration program was created under s. 95.51, Wis Stats. This program is intended to protect animal health and the security of the food chain. Among other things, premises registration facilitates a quicker response to animal disease emergencies. The location of livestock, or premises, is assigned a unique identification code. Currently there are more than 60,000 premises registered and maintained in a database. The additional funds will be used to administer the program and maintain the database.
