Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Under this bill, DNR may authorize a WPDES permit holder to discharge a pollutant above the levels authorized in the permit if the permit holder purchases credits from a clearinghouse that has contracted with the Department of Administration. The purchase of credits must result in an improvement in water quality, and the increase and reduction in pollutants under the agreement must involve the same pollutant or the same water quality standard and occur within the same area, as determined by DNR. That area must be the largest area possible within this state to facilitate implementation of the water pollution trading program while achieving water quality standards and any federally approved total maximum daily load allocations. The bill also allows DNR to authorize a permit holder to discharge a pollutant above the levels authorized in the permit if the permit holder enters into a contract with a third party that works with other sources of water pollution to reduce the amount of water pollution that those other sources cause.

Fiscal Effect

Industrial and municipal facilities covered by a water pollution discharge elimination system (WPDES) permit may employ water quality trading (trading) to acquire pollutant credits by entering into a binding, written agreement supporting a pollutant reduction from another party. To establish the agreement, a financial transaction generally occurs where the WPDES permit holder compensates involved parties for their pollution control costs which in this case could be handled by the clearinghouse. The clearinghouse may facilitate the sourcing of trade credits but there will be a workload for the program to ensure that the credits generated comply with the water trading requirements and that credits created and supplied through the clearinghouse can be fully implemented in WPDES permits.

Currently the phosphorus implementation coordinator in consult with additional staff reviews proposed trades for approval. The work of interacting with the clearinghouse (training on our methods, reviewing proposed trades) will be led by existing FTE staff and assisted by the other water quality statewide coordinators. An estimation of hours for existing staff, would be 0.45 FTE. In addition, the program may need to hire an LTE support staff.

- 1. 0.25 FTE water resources specialist (estimated \$24,800 salary and fringe)
- 2. 0.20 FTE water resources engineer (estimated \$23,500 salary and fringe)
- 3. 1 LTE water resources specialist (estimated \$24,400 salary and fringe)

These additional costs would be absorbed with the Department's existing budget. The work of reviewing proposed trades will happen whether the clearinghouse exists or not, so the work of overseeing the clearinghouse implementation will likely replace some of the other review work and may have little to no net long-term additional staff time.
