## Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Under the proposed legislation, local health department agent programs will not be able to charge a fee for a prelicensing inspection of a previously unlicensed retail food establishment that is a micro market. In making the estimate, the department assumed that micro market businesses would be started in the local health department jurisdictions. However, it is not known how many of these businesses will be newly licensed in the coming years. The department also assumed that micro market businesses will, to an unknown extent, replace vending machines. Local health department agent programs will no longer receive license fees for those vending machines that are replaced by micro markets. The license fee for micro markets is set in statute and is likely to be higher than the license fee for a single vending machine, but may be comparable to, or less, than the license fees collected for multiple vending machines at a place of business.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications
