## Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill modifies the conditions under which a Wisconsin Retirement System (WRS) participant may receive creditable service under the WRS for military service. Additionally, this bill requires that the Department of Corrections (DOC) make additional contributions as determined by the actuary and agreed to by the Employee Trust Funds (ETF) Board to cover the costs of granting the additional military service credits authorized under the bill.

As of 2/20/19, DOC employed 1,236 self-identified veterans, 1,188 of whom are in permanent positions. This bill has various provisions expanding eligibility for military service credits, and presumably would result in additional military service credits being earned by state employees. Any additional military service credits earned by state employees would result in greater WRS costs for the state when those employees retire.

However, due to a lack of available data regarding employees' military service, DOC is not able to estimate how many additional military service credits might be earned by state employees as a result of this bill's changes. Therefore, DOC is not able to estimate the presumed cost increase that would result from this bill.

Additionally, because the required contribution amount has not yet been determined, DOC is not able to estimate the cost increase to DOC that would result from the bill's requirement that DOC make additional contributions to cover the costs of granting the additional military service credits authorized under the bill.

Because of this bill's requirement that DOC make additional contributions to cover the costs of granting the additional military service credits authorized under the bill, this bill is assumed to have no local fiscal effect.
