Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

The bill requires the Department to include tick awareness information in all state park brochures. It also requires the Department, during Lyme Disease Awareness month (May), to conduct a campaign to raise Lyme disease awareness. The campaign must cover how to prevent tick bites and encourage people to check for ticks, using electronic methods including the department Internet site and social media, and print methods including the Wisconsin Natural Resources magazine.

Fiscal Effect

Two programs would be involved with the implementation of this bill--the Office of Communication and the Bureau of Parks and Recreation Management. Both programs would incur a minimal amount of staff time and associated costs to implement the provisions of the bill--Office of Communication: two hours of FTE staff time; Parks and Recreation: five hours of FTE staff time and ten hours of LTE staff time.
