Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

The shifting of the minimum required age for application for instruction permits will likely result in an initial, short-term, increase in applicants for both instruction permits and corresponding driver education.

CY2018 and CY2019 averaged approximately 4,300 instruction permits per month issued in this age range. The department estimates that this bill will immediately make 25,800 individuals newly eligible for an instruction permit, but assumes that those individuals will apply over the majority of the six-month period rather than all at once.

Under the bill, if all individuals who would have otherwise had to wait six months to apply make application inside of those six months, there could be an increase in work of less than 0.5 FTE for that six-month period. Driver education schools may have a similar short-term shift in work, as individuals who are already 15 years of age may attempt to register earlier than they would have otherwise.
