Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

The creation of additional processes creates a need to dedicate or obtain additional resources or personnel. This will, in turn, increase costs for staff time. The precise amount of the state increase is not possible to estimate because it depends entirely upon the amount of workload assumed by the Legislative Audit bureau. Local cities, villages, towns, and counties will likewise experience staff cost increases in order to facilitate the new processes. Local fiscal effects will vary significantly by jurisdiction, and thus cannot be stated herein.
