Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Senate Bill 1019 creates a Council of Equity and Inclusion housed at the Department of Administration. The Wisconsin Housing and Economic Development Authority (WHEDA) Executive Director or their designee is required to participate and appoint an officer for equity and inclusion for participation on the Council for Equity and Inclusion.

The Executive Director or their designee is required to meet with the Council quarterly in the development of a statewide plan and annual report. The WHEDA appointed officer for equity and inclusion must develop and implement an annual plan for equity and inclusion for WHEDA that must be submitted to the Council for review and approval.

WHEDA's current staff would be able to undertake this additional requirement. As WHEDA does not receive General Purpose Revenue (GPR) from the State for administration of operations, any additional time and compensation would be paid for through revenue generated by WHEDA's existing programs.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

Senate Bill 1019 does not include a sunset date, so this requirement would exist into perpetuity.
