Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

The Wisconsin Elections Commission will incur increased costs due to the labor involved processing and fulfilling reimbursement requests. These additional costs may be absorbed within the agency's budget. The fiscal estimate assumes that funds to reimburse local jurisdictions will be provided through either a new or existing appropriation.

Total fiscal impact on the state is difficult to assess since the number, type, and location of special elections varies from year-to-year. Election costs vary considerably across the state, with small counties incurring costs under \$10,000 and large counties spending over \$100,000 per election.
