Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Under current law, the Department of Justice is responsible for collecting and reporting certain types of crime data, including uniform crime data requested by the Federal Bureau of Investigation and law enforcement use of force data. This bill requires the department to collect specified data from the Director of State Courts for each criminal case, publish an annual interactive report on the department's website, and submit a report to the Legislature for distribution.

Complying with the additional data collection and reporting will require the department to modify the crime reporting data systems and establish reporting functionality with the Director of State Courts to facilitate the efficient and timely collection of data on an ongoing basis. The department estimates that the development of this system and the implementation of the interactive web-based reporting will cost \$350,000 initially and \$75,000 per year for licensing and maintenance based on recent comparable information technology projects. In addition, the design and implementation of the data collection, data validation and correction, data analysis and design and implementation of static and interactive reports will require 1.0 full-time equivalent Research Analyst position. The workload and additional costs exceed what can be absorbed within existing resources as the department's data analysis staff are dedicated to specific projects supported by restrictive funding sources and cannot be reassigned to ineligible grant activities.
