1. Basis and purpose of the proposed rule.

The objective of the rule is to update the provisions of the Department's administrative rules relating to the fees charged by the Safety and Buildings Division. The update is intended to provide a sufficient revenue stream to cover the operational costs of the division for four years.

2. How the proposed rule advances relevant statutory goals or purposes.

Section 101.19, Stats., requires the Department to fix and collect fees by rule which shall, as closely as possible, equal the cost of providing services such as plan examination, inspections, and permits to operate.

3. Changes to the rule analysis or fiscal estimate that was prepared for public hearing.

The fiscal estimate was revised indicating a reduction in the overall projected revenue increase to be realized. The original fiscal estimate indicated a revenue increase of \$2,915,700; the new project increase is now \$2,480,900. The reduction reflects the

Department's decision to reduce the fee increases for permits and credentials associated with the one- and two- family program.
