The provisions of Act 63 requiring state-wide licensure are effective April 1, 2013.  The department estimates that an additional 10,000 electricians and electrical will obtain license prior to April 1, 2013. The current 4-year license fees for an electrical contractor is \$200, a master electrician \$200, a journeyman electrician \$100 and a beginning electrician \$20. This will then result in additional annual revenues of \$458,500 with 2013 implementation.				
The department anticipates that workload associated with this licensing can be absorbed within current resources and staff levels.
