<u>Hearings Held</u> January 11, 2010 – Madison January 12, 2010 – Wausau January 15, 2010 - Milwaukee

The Madison hearing commenced at 10:00 a.m... Three persons attended, but only two offered verbal comments. Both the Wausau and Milwaukee hearings had no attendees.
