Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate Under s. 20.255 (2) (km), Stats., 2009 Wisconsin Act 28, the biennial budget bill, appropriated \$247,500 annually to create a new competitive grant program under s. 115.745, Stats. The grant program allows a school board or CESA in conjunction with a tribal education authority to apply to the department for a grant for the purpose of supporting innovative, effective instruction in one or more American Indian languages. The rule establishes criteria and procedures for awarding these program grants. The rule, itself, will not increase local revenue. It is the school district's choice as to whether it will apply for a grant and implement an American Indian language program. The costs associated with administering this grant program will be absorbed by the department.
