**EDUCATOR LICENSES**

**Analysis by the Department of Public Instruction**

**Statutory authority: s. 115.28 (7) (a), Stats.**

**Statute interpreted: s. 115.28 (7) (a), Stats.**

The Department proposes to amend its current rules governing educator licenses under PI 34 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code in order to streamline the process for educators who are military spouses to receive a teaching license in Wisconsin. As such, the Department's proposed rule creates a three-year nonrenewable Tier II license for spouses of active duty military personnel who hold a valid teacher, pupil services, or administrator license from another state and provides verification of the applicant's spouse's current military orders and a copy of either the applicant's marriage license or the military ID card for the applicant's spouse.

The hearing notice was published in the April 1, 2019 edition of the Wisconsin Administrative Register. A public hearing was held on April 22, 2019.

**2. Form, Style and Placement in Administrative Code:**

As such, the applicant is not required to affirm that he or she is married to the ID cardholder or establish that he or she is married to an individual who is an active duty military member. No changes are needed.
