IV. DETAILED STATEMENT EXPLAINING THE BASIS AND PURPOSE OF THE PROPOSED RULE, INCLUDING HOW THE PROPOSED RULE ADVANCES RELEVANT STATUTORY GOALS OR PURPOSES:

The proposed rule implements the statutory authority recently granted to the Physical Therapy Examining Board in 2019 Wisconsin Act 138. The Act created s. 448.52 (1m) (c), Stats., which authorizes the Board to promulgate rules related to the supervision of physical therapy students and physical therapy assistant students. Under this authority, the Board conducted an evaluation of its rules relating to the supervision of physical therapist students and physical therapist assistant students to ensure the rules are consistent with current professional practices and applicable Wisconsin statutes. As a result, updates have been made to do all of the following:

- Create definitions of "physical therapist," "physical therapist assistant," "physical therapist assistant student," "physical therapist student," and "student."
- Clarify that the holder of a temporary license as a physical therapist or a locum tenens license may not provide supervision of a physical therapist assistant, physical therapist student, physical therapist assistant student, or any unlicensed personnel.
- Establish requirements for the supervision of physical therapist students and physical therapist assistant students, and clarify that failure to provide adequate supervision as required under chs. PT 3 and 5 constitutes unprofessional conduct.

V. SUMMARY OF PUBLIC COMMENTS AND THE BOARD'S RESPONSES, EXPLANATION OF MODIFICATIONS TO PROPOSED RULES PROMPTED BY PUBLIC COMMENTS:

The Physical Therapy Examining Board held a public hearing on December 2, 2020. The Board did not receive any public comments.
